	An economist developing simulation models for tax, pension, and health policy on behalf of both the government and private clients, including major corporations, Judy spent almost a decade with the Congressional Joint Committee on Taxation, which has preeminent influence over Congressional tax policy. She also worked with the National Center for Health Services and the Medicare Payment Advisory Commission on health-care cost modeling. She also developed pension modeling for ERIC and other employer organizations.
